Each game consists of 28 rounds, in which players try to score four separate times for each of the seven categories marked on their score sheet.

If two people are playing, you can use the double-sided score sheet included with this game. If you're playing with more than two people, you can find Print \& Play score sheets at ninjaprint.se/regler

In Balut, you need to differentiate between the score - the totals of the dice rolled - and points, which are the points you're awarded for good scores, and which let you win.

First, we'll look at the scores.

In each turn, a player has up to three rolls of the dice - setting aside any they wish to use for a category and rolling all those left over. You do not have to use all three rolls. All players must then fill in a score for a category after each turn. If you can't
fulfil any of the criteria for a category - like if you only have fours left, but don't roll any fours - you have to enter zero next to it on the score sheet. (This happens a lot, so don't be disheartened.) Categories can be filled in in any order.

Now, we'll move on to the points.

After each player has had 28 turns and all the categories on their score sheets have been filled, the scores are added up. You then get points for good scores in your categories. The points awarded for each category score are as follows:

| CHOICES SCORES MORE THAN 100 | 2 P |
| EACH BALUT SCORES | 2 P |

Players then get (or lose) another set of points according to their total score, as shown in the following table:

All points are then added up, and the player with the highest points total wins the game. 29 points is the maximum score possible in a game.
